

Home Vermiculture and Home Vermicomposting

Friends of the Chico State Herbarium and the Gateway Science Museum are hosting this half-day workshop about home vermiculture and vermicomposting. Vermicomposting is a method of composting using special composting worms. Ward Habriel, dynamic master composter and former Organic Garden Manager for the Alameda County Waste Management Authority, will lead this in-depth workshop on home composting with worms. The workshop will cover the what, when, where, and how of vermicomposting and vermiculture to produce amazing and beneficial soil amendment and garden mulch. We will explore various scales of vermicomposting, from worm bins appropriate for “under the counter apartment living” to large backyard garden bins.



All needed materials and handouts will be provided, and the workshop will include two ten-minute breaks. The workshop will be held indoors, in the Chico State Herbarium in Holt Hall room 129.



The workshop will meet Saturday Sept. 19 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in Holt Hall room 129 at CSU Chico. The registration fee is \$20.00. Please register in advance; class size is limited to 25 participants (class cancelled without a minimum of 6 participants).
