She was department secretary, an Anthropology professor, and president for the campus chapter of the California State Employees Association before she retired in 1998. The children of Joanne Adams established this scholarship to honor their mother's memory by acknowledging student excellence in the study of human culture.

Dr. Turhon Allen Murad was born July 27, 1944 to Jabir Murat Ejupi and Henrietta Josephine Bowman in Whiting, Indiana. Turhon received his Ph.D. from Indiana University in 1975, and joined the Anthropology Department at Chico State in 1972. He served as Department Chair (1991-1997 & 2004-2006), as the Director of the Human Identification Laboratory (1972-1991 & 1997-2006), and developed and coordinated the Certificate in Forensic Identification (1995-2009). In 1989, he was certified as the 42nd Diplomat of the American Board of Forensic Anthropology. Dr. Murad assisted local and federal law enforcement in

forensic casework for 40 years, taught courses to law enforcement throughout California through Peace Officers Standards and Training, and mentored thousands of undergraduate and graduate students. He also participated in the FBI's Emergency Response Team seminars, and consulted with the U.S. Army's Central Identification Laboratory in Hawaii. Turhon passed away peacefully at home in the care of his family on August 15, 2015 and is survived by his wife Jackie Murad and his sons, Mark and Todd.

They soon married, started a family, and lived a full life together of love, political discussion, and activism for justice and peace. Upon Maurice's prospective retirement from Federal Administration in Alaska, Tillie and their family moved back to Tillie's college roots in Chico where she continued teaching. Maurice soon joined her.

Dr. Bob Ross was a faculty leader, accomplished scholar, and an important political force in the Chico community. Born in Canton, Ohio, he earned degrees from Miami University of Ohio (B.A.), University of Minnesota (B.S.), and University of Colorado (Ph.D.). He joined Chico State in 1968, served as Associate Dean of the School of Graduate Studies, as a principal in the Social Science Survey Center, and as Chair of the Political Science Department for 9 years. He retired from Chico after 39 years of service. Dr. Ross was also a prolific author, writing five books, some widely adopted as American government textbooks across the country, and he published 26 articles. Dr. Ross's dedication to public service included working with two local congressmen in Washington, establishing his own survey research consulting firm, and being elected to the Chico Unified School District Board of Trustees over a period of 12 years, and four terms as president. Dr. Ross was a builder, a leader, and a strategic thinker committed to first-rate education and public service. This award reflects that commitment.
