2) Discussion Items
(a) Campus Exterior Color Pallet

The campus consulting architect, Alan Butler from TLCD, returned to discuss the paint pallet for the campus. Two of the color options were shown on Glenn Hall, the tan and grey. Butler also talked about brick colors, it came to be understood that there are different versions of "railroad" blend. Traditionally the way the bricks were stacked during the firing process left flash marks on the bricks that gives it variation, the bricks are also tumbled to have rounded corners and broken off edges. There is a modern version of the 'railroad' blend (Similar to what was used on the Student Services Center) that doesn't have the flashing and rough edges. The different styles would be used depending on which part of campus the build was in.

Kaiser noted that she liked the green as an accent color to be added to the housing project. The green would keep the space warm and inviting and make it a more lively living space. Morse noted that the green color is still being planned for Sutter. Sutter will come back to the committee with the exact color scheme.

Today we wanted to address the campus overall, we want to have some limits in the amount of each color that can be used (i.e. accent colors). Ellis noted that we are evaluating the three choices of for the campus color pallet. Morse noted that the new buildings will still come to CPEC for review. Ellis asked if the committee felt comfortable with the color pallets, Kaiser asked that this item be moved to an action item, Scholtz seconded the motion. The committee agreed to move the campus color pallet item discussion to an action item. Same two moved to action.

3) Action Items

(a) Campus Color Pallet

Fry moved that the color pallet that was presented today (grey, tan and green) be accepted as the campus standard color pallet. Kaiser seconded the motion. The committee agreed to approve the campus color pallet as presented.

Kaiser moved that it also be agreed to have the two choices of the railroad blend as campus standards depending on the area of the campus the brick was used and that the anodized bronze would remain the campus standard as window frames. Fry seconded the motion. The committee agreed to approve the campus brick and widow frames standards.

4) Other

(a) None

Dwayne Knudson. Move storage container, west of acker gym next to one by tennis courts (old). Move further west and allow better access to the area by Acker. Moves it further away. One unit from behind acker to behind old tennis courts (where one already exists).

L Hoffman came late—all options can go forward.

Kaiser moved to action, scholtz second. So moved. Ellis asked why they are to different colors, knudson said that's what was available at the time Rellaford asked if they are owned or rented, knudson said own. Hoffman noted that this is an area that is shaded and fenced-knudson said yes. Kaiser suggested making them more symbolic of what they are used for.

Northern California Natural History Museum

Morse noted that ANOVA worked with TLCD to get a warmer color pallet on the building. Hoffman asked the color chips be compared to new adopted campus color pallet. Hoffman noted that we could just use the new standard colors. Morse noted that it is within the family of colors, it may not be exact of the new campus standard it is within the same family. The three colors are cherry cola (volcano), golden gate and rosewood.

Hoffman noted that it is close to Bidwell Mansion that the "warm" earth tones will go well with surrounding area.

The paint is in the material-elasticmeric paint.

Ellis asked if someone wants to move to an action item, Fry, move to action, Kaiser second.

Lindsch noted that she like the anova's browns better than the new campus standard brown, less mustard, more red. Hoffman asked suggest that the red/brown color could be added to the warm brown pallet—ask TLCD to look at possibly adding this to see how it might work.

Hoffman requested that a motion be make to TLCD to review the grey and tan pallets and how they relate to the new review NHM pallet has it relates to the new approved campus pallet. Amend. By rellafor. Kaiser seconded.
