- [Global Citizenship Survey](#), A WorldPublicOpinion.org survey of people in 21 nations from around the world finds that people who get to know people from other countries or who travel outside their country are more likely to view themselves as global citizens.

- [National Institutes of Health - International Research Collaborations on HIV/AIDS and Drug Use](#) (R01), The National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) fosters research related to biomedical and clinical science, epidemiology, prevention, and treatment of HIV/AIDS associated with drug use. The FOA, *International Research Collaborations on HIV/AIDS and Drug Use* (R01), seeks to foster international research collaborations with a regional geographic focus that take advantage of populations, resources, talent, or environmental/contextual conditions outside the U.S. that offer special opportunities to advance scientific knowledge. Deadline Oct 10, 2009.
- [Henry Luce Foundation/ACLS Grants to Individuals in East and Southeast Asian Archaeology and Early History](#). For the purposes of this program, "East and Southeast Asia" refers to Brunei, Burma/Myanmar, Cambodia, China, East Timor, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Laos, Macau, Malaysia, Mongolia, Philippines, Singapore, Taiwan, Thailand, and Vietnam. Deadline November 13, 2009.
- [Grants and Fellowships: The East European Studies Program](#) is appropriated by the U.S. Congress and administered by the U.S. Department of State under the Research and Training for Eastern Europe and the Independent States of the Former Soviet Union Act of 1983 as amended (Title VIII), whose purpose is the development of expertise in the United States needed for broad knowledge and analysis of developments in this critical world area. Grants are available for research, conference, travel, and language study (for institutions and individuals). Various deadlines Nov 2009-Jan 2010.
- [ACLS Humanities Program in Belarus, Russia, and Ukraine](#), ACLS announces a competition for short-term grants in the humanities for academic year 2009-2010. Deadline Nov 17, 2009.
- [Grant Opportunities for Academic Liaison with Industry](#), Promotes university-industry partnerships by making project funds or fellowships/traineeships available to support an eclectic mix of industry-university linkages. Special interest is focused on affording the opportunity for Faculty, postdoctoral fellows, and students to conduct research and gain experience in an industrial setting; Industrial scientists and engineers to bring industry's perspective and integrative skills to academe; and Interdisciplinary university-industry teams to conduct research projects.
- [Collaboration in Chemistry between US Investigators and their Counterparts Abroad](#), NSF Chemistry will accept collaborative research proposals in chemistry, written in English, that

establish new bilateral collaborations between U.S. investigators and investigators from Germany, Austria, United Kingdom, China or France. It is envisioned that the program will be expanded to include additional partnering foreign agencies in the coming years.

- **[International Polar Year Grant](#)**, The "International Polar Year 2007-2008" (IPY) will extend from March 2007 through March 2009. IPY is envisioned as an intense scientific campaign to explore new frontiers in polar science, improve our understanding of the critical role of the polar regions in global processes, and educate the public about the polar regions. Projects are expected to be interdisciplinary in scope; involve a pulse of activity during the IPY period; leave a legacy of infrastructure and data; expand international cooperation; engage the public in polar discovery; and help attract the next generation of scientists and engineers.
- **[NSF International Research and Education: Planning Visits and Workshops](#)**, This solicitation describes International Planning Visit/Workshop awards to support the early phases of developing and coordinating a research and education activity with a foreign partner(s). This program provides educational opportunities for Undergraduate Students, Graduate Students, Postdoctoral Fellows . This program provides indirect funding for students at this level or focuses on educational developments for this group such as curricula development, training or retention.
- **[NSF Materials World Network: Cooperative Activity in Materials Research between US Investigators and their Counterparts Abroad](#)**, Proposals submitted to NSF in response to this solicitation must have clear relevance to research supported by the NSF Division of Materials Research (DMR), as they will be evaluated within the context of programmatic areas within DMR: condensed matter physics, solid state and materials chemistry, polymers, biomaterials, metals, ceramics, electronic materials, and condensed matter and materials theory.
- **[NSF Pan-American Advanced Studies Institutes Program](#)**, The Pan American Advanced Study Institutes (PASI) Program, is a jointly supported initiative between the Department of Energy (DOE) and the National Science Foundation (NSF). Pan American Advanced Studies Institutes are short courses ranging in length from ten days to one month duration, involving lectures, demonstrations, research seminars and discussions at the advanced graduate and post-doctoral level. PASIs aim to disseminate advanced scientific and engineering knowledge and stimulate training and cooperation among researchers of the Americas in the mathematical, physical, and biological sciences, and in engineering fields. Whenever feasible, an interdisciplinary approach is recommended. Deadline Jan 15, 2010.

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
