This conference will be held March 19-21, 2009, in Washington, D.C. at the Hyatt Regency Washington on Capitol Hill. The original 1958 legislation continues today to support the National Resource Centers (NRC) program, the Foreign Language and Area Studies Fellowship (FLAS) program, and the International Research

and Studies (IRS) program. Over time, new programs have been added to Title VI to address the nation's growing need for international education in developing business expertise, strengthening undergraduate education, advancing international as well as area studies, cultivating technology use, and improving foreign language training and assessment.
