- [Grants: East European Studies Programs](#), Provides funding in several areas: Fellowships for Postdoc Research (11/12) awards up to \$25,000 for 3 fellowships; Dissertation Fellowships (11/12) awards up to \$18,000 for 10 fellowships; Language Grants to Individuals for Summer Study (1/16) awards up to \$2,500 for intensive summer study of Albanian, Bosnian-Croatian-Serbian, Bulgarian, Macedonian, or Romanian (12 awards); & Institutional Grants (1/16) awards up to \$10,000 to institutions supporting summer language programs. Travel & Conference Grants (1/30) and Heritage Speakers Grants (1/16) also available. Deadline Jan 16, 2009.
- [France: Carmago Foundation Residential Fellowships](#), Foundation maintains a center of studies in France for scholars who wish to pursue projects in the humanities & the social sciences related to French & francophone cultures. Also sponsors projects by visual artists, photographers, filmmakers, composers, & creative writers. Deadline Jan 12, 2009.

- [Grants for Overseas Research](#), Supports U.S. doctoral candidates & scholars with Ph.D.s in fields of the humanities, social sciences, or allied natural sciences. Must conduct research in more than one country, at least one of which hosts a participating American overseas research center (Bangladesh, Cambodia, Cyprus, Egypt, Greece, India, Israel, Italy, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nepal, Pakistan, Tunisia, Turkey, West Africa, West Bank/Gaza Strip & Yemen). - [18th Century Literature Visiting Fellowships](#), Supports short and long-term fellowships at the Houghton Library, which contains Harvard College's rare books & manuscripts, particularly European, English, American, & South American literature. Deadline Jan 16, 2009.
- [Japan-U.S. Grant Programs](#), Supports cooperation between the U.S. and Japan through three programs: Communication/Public Opinion funds projects that raise awareness & address issues

that affect bilateral relations & stimulate quality media coverage of relevant issues; Pre-college Education supports improved instruction about Japan in U.S. schools & the U.S. in Japanese schools through creative curriculum development & teacher training; U.S. Japan Policy funds projects in such areas as security, trade relations, environmental protection, energy, science & technology. - **Germany: Journalism Internships**, The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) is pleased to announce the second year of an intensive scholarship-supported summer seminar/internship program in Berlin for American journalism and communications students - called "internXchange". For the first six weeks of the internXchange program, participants will take part in a seminar series to expand their academic understanding of the politics, society and culture of Germany, and the country's current social conditions and media scene. The final five weeks consist of an intensive internship with a German newspaper, magazine, radio station or PR firm in or near Berlin. The program is targeted at undergraduate students, but a limited number of Master's students may be accepted.
- **Host a German Research Intern**, "RISE in North America," a new program of the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), offers American and Canadian institutions, including research groups, laboratories and doctoral students the chance to apply to host a motivated, English-proficient intern from Germany in their proposed project. The German intern will assist in research and lab work. The interns, who are students in the fields of biology, chemistry, physics, earth sciences, engineering, or a closely related field, receive a DAAD scholarship to help cover living expenses and travel costs. Term of the internship: 6 weeks to 3 months; earliest start date June 15, 2009. Submission of project proposals: November 12, 2008 to January 4, 2009
