- [HFA Trip to Peru and Machu Piccu](#), Jan 5-15, 2009. Machu Piccu is perched on a peak in the Andes, an Incan marvel of stonework, design and engineering. There are thousands of steps, 170 buildings, several temples, 16 fountains, all held up for centuries by a system of terraces. The tour to Peru and Machu Piccu will include three nights in Lima, five in Cuzco, and one in Machu Picchu. The faculty-in-residence is religious studies professor Dr. Andrew Flescher. CSU, Chico students may earn 1-3 units through Religious Studies. The \$3,616 package includes round-trip airfare from Sacramento; comfortable, well-located hotels with private baths; buffet breakfast daily, four lunches, and four dinners; guided sightseeing tours led by expert local guides in Lima, in Cuzco and in four sites of Incan ruins and in the Sacred Valley of the Incas; and the full-time services of a professional, bilingual tour director. A tax-deductible portion of the cost goes to college scholarships and programs.
