- **Housing for International Students and Scholars**, The School of Graduate, International, and Interdisciplinary Studies maintains a file of housing options for international students and visiting international scholars. - [Summer Fellowships for Advanced Turkish Language Study](#), Available to students as well as faculty members. Application deadline Feb 1, 2009.
- [Asian Studies Grants](#), Supports several grants to support the research of North American scholars to improve the quality of teaching about Asian cultures at the college & precollege levels. Deadline Feb 1, 2009.
- [Chinese Studies Travel Grants and Research Grants](#), Chiang Ching-kuo Foundation. Foundation's programs encompass 4 regions: Taiwan; the U.S., Canada & Mexico; the European region; & the Asia-Pacific region (including Hong Kong & Macau). Conference & Seminar Grants provide up to \$25,000 for institutions to host conferences & workshops on specific subjects related to Chinese studies. Travel Grants fund travel (of up to \$1,000) for professors to present papers on Chinese studies. Supports research on Chinese Studies in the humanities and social sciences. Researchers focusing on the social, cultural, economic or political development of Taiwan over the past few decades are especially encouraged to apply.
- [Research Fellowship, History of Media in Early Modern Europe](#), Supports year-long residential fellowships at the Clark Library for scholars who received the Ph.D. within the last six years and are engaged in research related to an annual theme. The 2009-10 theme is, "Cultures Of Communication, Theologies Of Media In Early Modern Europe And Beyond". Deadline Feb 1, 2009.
- [Fellowships in British Studies and British Literature](#), Four residential fellowship programs support postdoctoral research at UCLA's Clark Library, which specializes in 17th & 18th century

studies: Clark Short-Term Fellowships (\$2,500 per month for 1 to 3 months); ASECS/Clark Fellowships (\$2,500 for one month of research on Restoration or the 18th century); Kanner Fellowship in British Studies (\$7,500 for 3 months); & Clark-Huntington Joint Bibliographical Fellowship (\$5,000 for two months of research in early modern British literature & history). Deadline Feb 1, 2009.

- **Europe and Eurasia Travel Grants**, Fellowships for up to eight weeks to U.S. postdoc scholars & holders of other graduate degrees for independent or collaborative research projects in Europe & Eurasia. Countries eligible for research include: Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Kosovo, Macedonia, Moldova, Romania, Russia, Serbia & Montenegro, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, & Uzbekistan. Limited funding is also available for: Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Slovakia, & Slovenia. Deadline Feb 2, 2009.
- **Russian, Eurasian, and East European Research Grants**, Supports humanities & social science policy research on Russian, Eurasian & East European social, political, economic, & historical development. National Research Competition & Collaborative Humanities Research Fellowship (2/13) supports collaborative & individual research. Hewett Fellowships (3/13) support research under a U.S. government agency. Short-term Travel Grants (4/15 & 12/15) also available.
- **U.S. – Japan, Creative Artists Fellowship Program**, Provides funds for up to five artists to complete residency in any area of Japan during a six-month period. Applicants may include architects, choreographers, composers, creative writers, designers, media artists, playwrights, solo theater artists, visual artists, multidisciplinary artists, & artistic directors. Preference is given to applicants for whom this will be a first-time residency in Japan. Provides transportation & living costs, a monthly stipend, & pre-departure Japanese language study.
- **Fellowship: University of Edinburgh**, Supports up to 20 fellows annually for residencies of up to six months at the University of Edinburgh. No limitation will be placed on the area of research within the Humanities, broadly conceived. Priority will be given to those whose work falls within the scope of one of the Institute current Research Themes: Dialogues of Enlightenment; Translations, Adaptations and Modalities; Theory in Practice, Practice in Theory; The Humanities in the 21st Century University. Most fellowships are honorary, but limited support for expenses is sometimes available.
