The purpose of these grants is to provide support for faculty travel, release time, course development and /or creation of instructional enhancements that promotes one or more of these university strategic priorities. - **[Undergraduate and Graduate Scholarships for Research in Germany](#)**, This specialized DAAD program offers up to five German Studies Research Grants to highly qualified undergraduate and graduate students who are nominated by their department/ program chairs. The grant may be used for short-term research (one to two months) in either North America or Germany. Deadline May 1, 2008.
- **[Fellowship for British Collaboration](#)**, Fellowship for scholars from the Americas to visit and engage in collaborative activities with members of Economic and Social Research Council supported projects in Britain, or for British scholars at ESRC-supported projects to visit collaborators in the Americas. Approx. 18 research fellowships of up to \$9,950 will be awarded. Deadline April 4, 2008.
- **[Theatre Travel Grants for Russia, Eastern and Central Europe](#)**, Supports cultural exchange & artistic partnerships between theatre professionals in the United States and their counterparts in Russia and Eastern and Central Europe. There are various grants for writers, directors, actors, educators, and administrators. Awards are \$3000 each and can be used for travel, living expenses, project materials, interpreters, etc. Deadline Mar 31, 2008.
