- [Fellowships for Middle East and Egypt](#), American Research Center provides fellowships to enhance American awareness and understanding of the Middle East in general and Egypt in particular by providing research opportunities.
- [JET Program: Teaching English in Japan](#), All students who will be graduating by July 1, 2009 are invited to apply for the JET program. Selected applicants will teach English conversation classes in schools or coordinate activities within the local government. Japanese language skills are not required for the teaching positions. All majors are welcome. Application deadline Tuesday, November 25, 2008.
- [Student Research Opportunity: Global Change](#), Sponsored by the U.S. Department of Energy, undergraduate and graduate students have the opportunity to participate in research carried out by national agencies.
- [Boren Scholarships for Study Abroad](#), Supports U.S. undergraduates and graduates studying world regions critical to U.S. interests, including Africa, Asia, Central & Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America & the Caribbean, and the Middle East. Western Europe, Canada, Australia, & New Zealand are excluded.

- [Fulbright-Hays Faculty Research Abroad \(FRA\) Fellowship Program CFDA 84.019A](#), Applications must focus on one or more of the following geographic areas: Africa, East Asia, Southeast Asia and the Pacific Islands, South Asia, the Near East, East Central Europe and Eurasia, and the Western Hemisphere (excluding the U.S. and its territories and excluding Western Europe). There is a competitive preference for projects that focus on any of the 78 languages deemed critical on ED's list of Less Commonly Taught Languages (LCTLs). All applications from CSU, Chico faculty must be submitted together. CSU, Chico's Office of Research and Sponsored Programs will coordinate submission and provide support to faculty in preparing proposals. Contact Diane Johnson at Research and Sponsored Programs *as soon as possible* if you are interested, the deadline is in a few weeks.
- [Sweden: Grants for Study or Research](#), provides two to four week intensive research trips within the fields of public policy, economics, science, healthcare, education, media or culture. Deadline Nov 15, 2008.
- [France: Chateaubriand Fellowship Program](#), Provides predoctoral & postdoctoral (Ph.D. earned within the last three years) fellowship support for U.S. citizens in scientific, engineering, & medical disciplines to study economic, political, & social aspects of contemporary France. Deadline Dec 15, 2008.
- [Research Fellowships: Colonial History](#), Provides residential fellowships for advanced research to scholars whose work involves the colonial history of the Americas, North & South, including all aspects of the European, African, & Native-American involvement. Deadline Jan 10, 2009.
- [Literature Translation Grants](#), Provides fellowships (\$12.5K or \$20K) to exceptionally talented, published translators, for the translation of specific works of published prose, poetry, or drama from other languages into English. Encourages translations of writers and of works not well represented in English translation. The work to be translated should be of interest for its literary excellence and value. Deadline Jan 9, 2009.
- [European Arts and Architecture Grants](#), Grants are concentrated on projects and programs that promote the understanding and enjoyment of European art and architecture, especially in relation to its historical context. Funding is offered under two main areas: The Care and Presentation of European Art and The Practice of Art History and Conservation. Deadline Jan 15, 2009.
- [Jennings Randolph Program for International Peace](#), Senior Fellowships (9/8) are awarded to professionals in the broad areas of international peace & conflict management. Program is open to individuals with national or international stature in conflict resolution & mid-career professionals. Senior Fellows work in residence at USIP in Washington, D.C. for up to 10 months for up to \$80,000. Peace Scholar Dissertation Fellowship. Awards (1/5) provide \$20,000 for one year of writing or field research. Must have completed all Ph.D. coursework.
