- **Dr. Susan Place**, Dean of the School of Graduate, International, and Interdisciplinary Studies, was invited to present a plenary address on "Contributions of Geography to Sustainable Development" (La Geografía: Aportes al Desarrollo Sostenible) at the 35th anniversary of the establishment of the School of Geography at the National University of Costa Rica (Universidad Nacional de Costa Rica), in Heredia, Costa Rica on July 22, 2008. While in Costa Rica, Dr. Place also visited the site of USAC's new study abroad program in San Ramon. This program focuses on tropical ecology and environmental studies, and expands Chico State's curricular offerings related to sustainability.

- [Canadian Studies Grant for Course Development](#), Provides up to \$6,000 to tenure-track faculty who are developing or modifying a course that has substantial Canadian content. Deadline October 31, 2008.
- [American Council of Learned Societies Fellowships](#), Provides approximately 10 fellowships for six to 12 months of humanistic research & writing on the societies and cultures of Asia, Africa, Middle East, Latin America & the Caribbean, Eastern Europe, & the former Soviet Union. Deadline October 2, 2008.
- [Fulbright European Union Scholar-in-Residence Program](#), Brings European scholars to U.S. campuses to give lectures, conduct seminars, consult on research, and provide outreach to the community. Deadline October 15, 2008.
- [Fulbright Worldwide Scholar-in-Residence Program](#), Brings scholars & professionals from abroad to U.S. colleges & universities that infrequently or never have the opportunity to

host visiting scholars. In addition to teaching courses, scholars give campus-wide & community lectures, help initiate international programs, & contribute to curriculum development. Deadline October 15, 2008.

- [**Fulbright U.S. Student Program**](#), Program awards recent BA/BS graduates, master's candidates, and young professionals/artists opportunity to study or conduct research abroad for one year. Deadline October 20, 2008.
- [**Chinese Studies Research Grants**](#), Provides support for research in the humanities and social sciences. Deadline October 15, 2008.
- [**Japanese Studies Grants**](#), Japan Foundation sponsors a variety of grant programs relating to arts and cultural exchange, Japanese Studies and Intellectual Exchange, and Japanese-Language Education Overseas. There is assistance for media related projects such as publications, translation, and film or video production. Deadline September 2, 2008.
- [**JSPS Fellowship for Research in Japan**](#), Offers funds for research in Japan. Deadline September 1, 2008.
- [**Woodrow Wilson Center Fellowships**](#), Awards approximately 20-25 residential fellowships annually to individuals with outstanding proposals related to social sciences and humanities on national and/or international issues. Deadline October 1, 2008.
