Data-Driven Innovation

New **Student Success Dashboards** are driving improvements in teaching, advising, and curriculum development, allowing campus-wide exploration of our students' achievement and persistence at the university, college, department and course levels.


Now in its third year, the **Institutional Research Faculty Fellow program** provides insight into the complex factors affecting grades, retention, and graduation rates, leading to new interventions to improve pass rates in critical early courses.

Sustaining Student Success

REACH: Peer-Mentored Hubs and Wrap-around Support

Now in its fifth year, REACH (Raising Educational Achievement in Collaborative Hubs) provides peer and faculty mentoring for low income and first generation college students.

Participating students persist from year one to year two at an average rate of 6.3% higher than the University average.




Closing persistent equity gaps in achievement and graduation will rely on our ability to expand successful programs like this to serve our growing first-generation and low income student population

FYE: Engaging First-Year Students for Persistence and Purpose

Chico's signature **Public Sphere Pedagogy** programs like the Town Hall Meeting and Chico Great Debate, now implemented on campuses nationwide, continue to demonstrate positive effects on second year retention, pass rates, and levels of classroom community and academic engagement, with even greater impacts on students of color. These programs now serve more than 2,000 students per year.

SI: Instruction Support Improves Grades for Thousands

Supplemental Instruction (SI) supported by GI funding continues to grow and demonstrate great success in both the number of students served and the impact on their grades. In 2017-2018, 2130 students attended SI sessions a total of over 17,000 times. On average, those that attended SI earned half a grade higher than those who did not. Those that attended SI consistently (8 or more times a semester) earned a whole letter grade higher than those who never attended.
