HONORS HOUSES at Konkow Hall, CSU, Chico

Konkow Hall is one of three residence halls located in the north campus housing complex (Esken, Mechoopda & Konkow Halls). Its six "houses" comprise part of the university's Thematic Living Program. Honors houses occupy four of Konkow's six units. Each unit houses 13 residents plus a student resident adviser (RA) who is usually a former Honors house resident. Unlike most residence halls, each unit includes standard double rooms, plus a large living and dining room, a large kitchen equipped with two stoves, three refrigerators, a dishwasher, and plenty of kitchen storage space.

The annual fee for Konkow Hall is lower than other on-campus residence halls that include a meal plan; however, in addition to the full-service kitchen, supplemental meal plans can be purchased from Housing and Food Services if desired. There is a computer lab on site plus individual Ethernet connections. The Konkow Embassy is an on-site common room available for individual use and/or study groups, campus organizations, and social activities. An electric piano has been added by the Honors Program to the Embassy for resident use.

This unique environment blends elements of dorm life and apartment life. Honors houses provide residents with a quiet academic environment balanced with numerous social activities. Through the combined efforts of residents, RAs, and faculty mentors, the Honors houses thrive as a living environment that enhances your first year experience.

Space is limited, and your completed Honors in General Education Program *application must be received* before you can be placed on the list for the Honors Houses. Early submission of your Honors in GE application is strongly encouraged.
