

Fall 2013 Honors in General Education Redesign Crosswalk for Current Honors Students

If you will be a sophomore in Fall 2013

You should have completed at least three units of Honors course work. Your total unit requirements will drop from 27 units to 24 units. You have two options.

Option 1: You may complete your 24 unit requirement by taking courses from HNRS 120 C,D,E (9 units), HNRS 201H, 202H, 203H and 204H to complete a total of 15 lower division units. Then you will take two upper division Honors courses (3 units each) and HNRS 499H (3 units), the one-semester Honors thesis. Note that the two upper-division courses should be in the same Pathway, and your thesis should be appropriate for that Pathway.

Option 2: You may complete your 24 unit requirement by taking courses from HNRS 120 C,D,E (9 units), HNRS 201H, 202H, 203H and 204H to complete a total of 12 lower division units. As a junior you will take two upper division Honors courses (3 units each), and as a senior you will take HNRS 399H (3 units) and HNRS 499H (3 units), which collectively are the year-long Honors thesis. Note that your thesis should be appropriate for a Pathway associated with one of the upper division Honors courses you take as a junior.

If you will be a junior or senior in Fall 2013

You should have completed all your lower division requirements. You will be expected to complete two upper division courses and HNRS 499H (3 units), the one-semester Honors thesis.

If you plan to study abroad

You can expect to get up to two courses from abroad to substitute as upper division Honors courses upon approval by the Honors Advisor. Typically, you will complete an upper division Honors course associated with area UD-B at CSU Chico. If are pursuing Option 2 and do not complete UD-B abroad or with your thesis, you may substitute an HNRS UD-B course for HNRS 399H. Anyone pursuing Option 2 who is granted substitution from abroad will be expected to substantially incorporate their study abroad experience in their thesis. Note also, that to be counted for a Pathway, study abroad courses must be approved by a Pathway coordinator.
