Note that J351 and J 355 count in EITHER Group B or C. Journalism majors must graduate with 80 units taken outside the School of Communication with the exception of CMST 131, 132, 255 and 334. These 80 units would be general education, minor and electives outside JOUR, CMST, and CDES. Of those 80 units, 65 must be courses categorized as “liberal arts & sciences.” You earn 54 of these units through your GE courses and History/Constitution/American Ideals requirement. The other units come from your minor and/or electives. A maximum of six transfer units from a community college (equivalents to JOUR 101 and JOUR 260) may be used for credit in the major. See your adviser if you have questions on your catalog requirements. Advising is required of journalism majors every semester.
