

Greg Liggett:

Greg Liggett is the Executive Director of the Northern California Natural History Museum at California State University, Chico. His current responsibilities include orchestrating the growth and development of the new Northern California Natural History Museum in all its aspects, including current education and outreach programming, the museum's physical facility and public exhibits, biological and geological research collections, identity and marketing, and administration.

Prior to coming to Chico, he was the Assistant Director of the Sternberg Museum of Natural History at Fort Hays State University in Hays, Kansas. The Sternberg Museum is a well-established university museum, renowned for its fossil collections. While Liggett was there, the museum was completely updated from its small, on-campus location to a newly renovated and very large facility across town.

Liggett's scientific training is in geology and vertebrate paleontology. He has led a number of fossil excavations across the plains states, collecting and studying a wide variety of fossil animals, including flying reptiles, giant sea reptiles, camels, horses, rhinos, and bone-crushing dogs. Most recently, he has been studying mammoths. He has published scientific papers, popular articles in magazines and newspapers, and one book.
