The CBEST and CSET Exams

- CBEST: Consists of three sections and is designed to test basic reading, mathematics, and writing skills found to be important for the job of an educator
- CSET Writing Skills: Is a single test that can only be used in combination with CSET: Multiple Subjects to satisfy the basic skills requirement. It consists of two constructed-response questions



The CBEST and CSET Exams

- CSET Multiple Subject: Consists of three ***separate*** subtests, each of which is composed of both multiple-choice and constructed-response questions. The three subtests are as follows:
 - Reading, Language, and Literature; History and Social Science
 - Science and Mathematics
 - Physical Education, Human Development, Visual and Performing Arts
