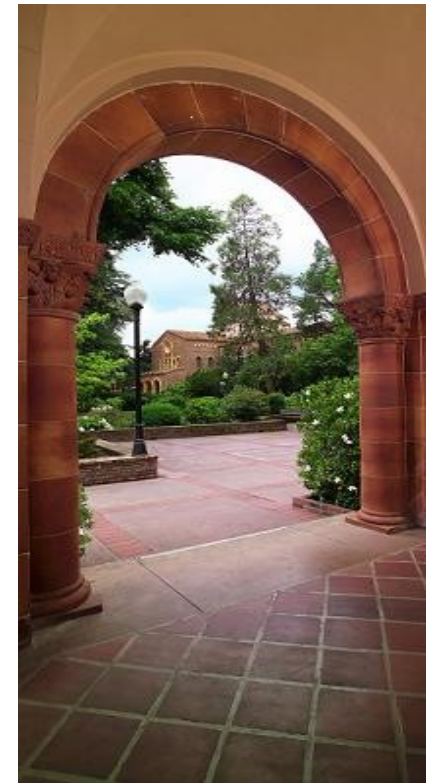

About the Master's Program



The part-time, online master's program at California State University, Chico is geared to meet the needs of working nurses in rural areas.

The program admits in the Fall semester of even years (2010, 2012) and offers 6 units of coursework each semester for five semesters, culminating in a final thesis, project or professional paper.

All the major theory courses required for the master's program are offered online. Teaching and adult health practica can usually be completed in a facility near you.

If you have a new computer and broadband Internet access, you can meet most course requirements from the comfort of your own home, yet remain connected with the course instructor and classmates.

- Seamless transition—move directly from your BSN to our MSN program.
- Courses in research, nursing theory, technology and advanced nursing roles assist the student in the transition into the expanded roles opened up by a master's degree in nursing.
- We encourage and facilitate the development of each student's own area of clinical interest within the adult health focus of the program.
- The educator core courses provide a comprehensive foundation in teaching/learning and curriculum, which facilitates the student's movement into faculty or staff development roles.
- Our graduates are functioning in influential educational, administrative, and adviser positions throughout the state.
- Teaching with advanced technology such as the Human Response Simulation lab will give you a competitive edge in Associate and BSN faculty positions.
- Students are encouraged to maintain their clinical practice—but program completion can be facilitated with part-time employment.



Admission Criteria

- ✓ A baccalaureate degree in nursing from a program accredited by a national nursing accrediting body.
- ✓ A current California license to practice as a registered nurse.
- ✓ A 3-unit course in basic statistics with a grade of C or better, completed within the five years prior to admission to the graduate program.
- ✓ Completion of the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) or Miller Analogies Test (MAT) within the previous 5 years. You may schedule at:

- ✓ A letter of intent submitted to the Graduate Coordinator in the School of Nursing.
