Daryl Hannah

Daryl Hannah has been passionate and committed to practicing a low-impact lifestyle for nearly 20 years. From her small footprint, passive and active solar home complete with gray water systems and organic garden, to being an early adaptor of biofuels, Daryl Hannah has been actively spreading the good news of how well it all works and how good it all feels.

Hannah has produced, hosted, and shot numerous green TV appearances including pieces for CNN International and *Good Morning America*. She relishes and has seized the opportunity on many occasions to speak to the unconvinced, such as Bill O'Reilly and Sean Hannity.

Hannah has been a greening consultant for events such as the Virgin Music Festival, attended by more than 150,000 people.

Her many speaking engagements include keynote speeches at the UN Global Business Conference on the environment, the National Biodiesel Board Conference, Natural and Organic Products Expo, LOHAS, and many others.

Hannah was recently invited by the president of the United Nations General Assembly to be a featured speaker to address dignitaries from the United Nations member states, representatives of the media, the scientific community, and the private sector at a Thematic Debate of the General Assembly on the Global Climate Crisis.

She has written articles on sustainability for many magazines including *Jane*, *Marie Claire*, and *Veg News* to name a few.

She designed and films *dhlovelife*, her Web site dedicated to sharing solutions on how to live more harmoniously with the planet and all other living things. The site features weekly five-minute inspirational video blogs, daily news updates, alerts, community and access to goods and services.

Hannah is also the founder of the Sustainable Biodiesel Alliance, which is a certification program for sustainably produced, harvested, and produced biofuels and sits on the board of the Environmental Media Association, Eco America, the Sustainable Biodiesel Alliance, and the Action Sports Environmental Coalition.

Hannah is a documentary and narrative filmmaker, which she has both directed, written, and produced. Her short film, *The Last Supper*, won a prize at the Berlin Film Festival among others and she is editing a documentary at the moment.

Hannah has acted in more than 45 feature films since the age of 11, invented board games and toys, keeps bees, rescues stray animals, and loves music, hot springs, wild things, and wilderness.

Klean Kanteen was developed specifically out of concern for human health, particularly with regard to the presence of bisphenol-a (BPA) and other unhealthy chemicals in reusable polycarbonate bottles, as well as the detriments to environmental health from disposal of single-use plastic water bottles. In March 2009, Klean Kanteen was recognized for its commitment to alleviating waste and pollution with a special award of recognition from the Lieutenant Governor of California, as well as an Ocean Heroes Award from a consortium of non-profits, including the Natural Resources Defense Council, Environment California, Heal the Bay, Surfrider Foundation, Ocean Conservancy, and Monterey Bay Aquarium.

When it comes to business at Klean Kanteen, success is measured in ways beyond simply the bottom line. Quality production, fair labor, and environmental responsibility are all key goals for the company here in Chico as well as manufacturing overseas. Klean Kanteen continues to evaluate its business practices for ways to improve efficiencies and reduce waste, with a deliberate effort to keep the earth in mind. While Klean Kanteens are made in China (all stainless bottles on the market are from Asia), the company has deliberately chosen to build a partnering relationship with the manufacturer rather than simply place orders like many competitors do. By engaging in partnership, Klean Kanteen finds greater opportunity to meet its quality, fair labor, and environmental goals so far from home. While not all solutions have been identified for some of the challenges at hand, the family and friends at Klean Kanteen are committed to accounting for environmental and human health in their business practices. It is simply the right thing to do.
