2001-02 Objectives and Outcomes

- 1. Facilitate the implementation of the portal (Chico State Connection) as fully as the system will allow for SAO and Student Organizations.**

Outcome: The project has been slowed by numerous software compatibility problems. Technical problems have plagued the system. Currently, SAO's "Campus Life" section is a great vehicle for highlighting student programs and campus events, but is only usable by a very small test group of users. Computer Services indicates that they hope the entire system will be available to the student body early fall 2002.

2. Organize and host a training for the Prime for Life Program, Students Talking About Alcohol on Campus.

Outcome: CADEC hosted the PRI training for 15 representatives from various Student Affairs units including Housing, Wellness, Athletics, EOP and Greek Life. Housing staff members then used the PRI programs to also train 59 RAS, RDS, and RCC in January 2002. ON follow up meetings with the initial training attendees, it was determined that the PRI class was too long to substitute for the current Saturday Substance Abuse Class.

3. CADEC will assist in the implementation of the first year Survivor Series Program, which is designed to present a series of lectures and activities for student living in residence halls.

Outcome: CADEC along with Housing, Wellness Center, and Student Health conducted 7 workshops in the residence halls during the Fall 2001 semester. In addition, during the Spring 2002 semester, an overnight rafting trip was held for the students who participated in the series.

4. Update the leadership website.

Outcome: The leadership website has been slow in its development. The current plan is to revise the website the Fall of 2002.

5. Update the Leadership Opportunities booklet.

Outcome: Has continued to be distributed and will be update in 2003.

6. Provide Risk Management information and workshops to student organization advisors.

Outcome: Precipitated by the new student organization alcohol policy requirement, and the subsequent campus debate, the role and responsibility of advisors has taken on a higher profile within the campus community. As a result, SAO has had the opportunity to engage in numerous discussions with advisors, deans, and department chairs on issues pertaining to role(s) of the advisor. The use of email and the web continues to increase SAO's contact with the student leaders of the student organizations.

7. Increase active participation of all Ethnic Greeks in the Ethnic Greek Council.

Outcome: Four additional organizations became active in the Ethnic Greek Council during 2001-2002. Attendance was increased at the weekly meetings. Improved goals were established by the council.

8. Establish a new Greek Member Seminar Series entitled "Greek 101."

Outcome: Greek Life advisor researched new member programs on other campuses. It was determined that in order to fully implement the program on this campus SAO would need additional funding for the program. SAO will be looking for ways to implement the program during 2002-2003.

9. Meet with each member of IFC and Panhellenic executive boards to work with them on their goals and objectives for the academic year.

Outcome: The Greek advisor was able to meet individually, twice each semester, to discuss goals with each executive board member. The Greek Life advisor also met with IFC and Panhellenic presidents once a week and attended their regular meeting along with their executive board meetings.

- To implement the Office and Traffic Safety Sober Initiative Grant (Goal 3).

- To develop a verified informational brochure for the Ethnic Greek Council (Goal 4).
- To establish long range goals for the student organizations housed in the Multicultural Center (Goal 4).
