Goals and Accomplishments for 2002-2003

1. Establish a Men's Discussion Group
 - Establishing a discussion group was delayed for the 2002-2003 academic year. As the country prepared for war it also effected the operation within the SHS. The two nurse practitioners designated to spearhead the discussion group are both in the reserves and were on call for assignment at a moments notice.
2. Create a Student Health Service Publication
 - This is still a work in progress. One of the tasks for the fall intern is to establish this publication.
3. Clinical Trials
 - During the 2002-2003 academic year the SHS successfully participated in five clinical trials.
4. Staff members at SHS have successfully completed their first aid training. Ongoing staff development and continuing education remains a vital component to the overall educational component of the center.
5. The SHS has successfully passed accreditation by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care, Inc. (AAAHC) in October 2002,
6. The California State University, Chico Student Health Service successfully hosted the CSU SHS Directors' meeting held on October 23-25 2002.
7. The California State University, Chico Student Health Service successfully hosted the CSU SHS Pharmacy Supervisors' Meeting, which was held on January 16 & 17, 2003.
8. Investigated the replacement of our x-ray equipment.

Other Accomplishments:

The Student Health Service actively participated in the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA) Minority Undergraduate Fellowship Program (MUFP). The purpose of the program is to increase the number of persons of ethnic-minority and/or persons with disabilities to consider a career in Student Affairs and

Higher Education. Student Health Service is committed in maintaining five students in the program.

Delmy, our first student, concluded her spring semester with a rotation through Student Judicial Affairs, under the supervision of Mary Oling-Otto. As California State University, Chico's first MUFPP graduate, she is in the process of completing her eight-week internship at Florida International University and participating in the leadership conference at Duke University, Delmy will begin graduate studies this fall at California State University, Sacramento.
