BA in Liberal Studies/Child Development

The Liberal Studies program focuses on educating high-quality professionals who have a strong knowledge-base and the experiential background to teach in a diverse society. It is designed to provide students with a broadly based liberal arts degree in English, the sciences and math, humanities and fine arts, social sciences, and an area of concentrated study selected by the student.

The Liberal Studies major (except the non-credential pattern) meets the standards of the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing for the diversified major but does NOT waive the necessity of passing the California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET): Multiple Subject.

The General (Pre-credential) Pattern

This pattern is for students who wish to enter a credential program with elementary subject matter prerequisites met.

The General Online (Pre-credential) Pattern

This is a degree completion pattern for students living outside of Chico. All lower-division courses and some upper-division courses must be completed by taking equivalents at a community college or other four-year institution. Please contact an advisor at lsonadv@csuchico.edu for information.

The Bilingual/Cross-cultural Pattern

Students entering the Bilingual Professional Preparation Program must take the Liberal Studies core courses and the Bilingual Pattern Requirements. This pattern includes courses in Spanish, Mexican/Latino history and culture, and the teaching of English as a second language. Other languages and cultures are possible.

The Liberal Arts (Non-credential) Pattern

Students who wish to obtain a liberal arts and sciences background and do not intend to enter the teaching profession select this pattern.

The Liberal Studies Integrated Teacher CORE (ITC) Multiple Subject Teaching Credential (Blended Program)

The Integrated Teacher CORE combines the BA in Liberal Studies and the Multiple Subject Credential Program. Early field experiences, integrated curriculum, and a streamlined, focused program are the ITC's distinctive features. This program can be completed in less time than by traditional means.

The Liberal Studies/Child Development Double Major Pattern

Students wishing to obtain two majors within their BA degree, preparing for careers in both elementary teaching and early childhood education, may choose the double major.

Career Outlooks

The projected need for elementary educators over the next five years in California is high. See a Liberal Studies advisor for information on subject matter authorizations and minors to develop even broader teaching opportunities. Businesses and the helping professions are interested in hiring competent people with liberal arts and sciences backgrounds. Students should consult with their advisor or a career counselor concerning the range of opportunities.

Subject Matter Competency

All students who plan to enter a credential program must further demonstrate competency in the subject matter by passing the California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET): Multiple Subject. Liberal Studies advisors will provide you with information about the exams and prerequisites for credential programs

You must pass ENGL 130 (or its equivalent) with a C- or better before you may register for a WP course.

General Online (Pre-Credential) Pattern: 30-33 units

Students who select this pattern do not live in Chico and are not able to physically be on campus. The equivalents of all lower-division course work and the equivalents of GEOS 342, MATH 310, BIOL 342, and ARTS 493 or MUSC 326 are taken at a community college or other four-year institution. The online Area of Concentration is Environmental Studies, but the equivalent of other Areas of Concentration may be completed at another institution. The remaining upper-division course work, as well as most credential program prerequisites, are offered online. Students in this pattern who are applying to a credential program at CSU, Chico, are encouraged to check on the prerequisites of the credential program of their choice. Online students are encouraged to contact an advisor early for a MAP and schedule of course offerings.

Bilingual/Cross-Cultural Pattern (Pre-Credential) Pattern: 41 units

Students selecting the Bilingual/Cross-cultural Pattern should consult with an advisor in the Center for Bilingual/Multicultural Studies as well as with a Liberal Studies Advisor.

Liberal Arts Pattern (non-credential): 30-33 units

This pattern is designed for students who want a broad liberal arts and sciences degree but are not interested in pursuing the teaching credential. Public school experience is not required for the non-credential pattern. It is important to see an advisor for help in planning your program. Normally, students selecting this pattern complete the following program:

The Liberal Studies lower- and upper-division major core program of 76 units; 12-15 units in an Area of Concentration; and 18 units or more for a minor. Students who select a second major of 30 units or more will fulfill the Area of Concentration requirements.

Electives Requirement:

To complete the total units required for the bachelor's degree, select additional elective courses from the total University offerings. You should consult with an advisor regarding the selection of courses which will provide breadth to your University experience and possibly apply to a supportive second major or minor.

Students should also check with their advisor on applying elective courses to requirements for authorizations which permit teaching in grades 7 through 9 in a departmentalized setting.

Students working toward a credential may use Professional Program prerequisite courses as elective units towards the Liberal Studies degree.

- (a) Students who plan to enter the Bilingual or Tri-Placement Program must also take SPED 343 and EDTE 440.
- (b) Students who plan to enter the Special Education Concurrent Program must complete the Special Education minor to satisfy all program prerequisites.
- (c) Students who plan to enter all other Multiple Subject Programs meet the Introductory School Experience requirement by taking EDTE 255. They also must take EDTE 301 and EDTE 520.

Advising Requirement:

Advising is mandatory for all majors in this degree program. Consult your undergraduate advisor for specific information.

The Multiple Subject Teaching Credential

Subject Matter Competence/CSET

Under current teacher credential legislation in California, candidates for a Multiple Subject Teaching Credential must pass the California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET): Multiple Subject to meet subject matter competence requirements. The Multiple Subject Credential authorizes the holder to teach all subjects in a self-contained classroom where one teacher is responsible for teaching most or all subjects to one group of pupils in the course of a day. Most elementary schools, some preschools, and a few middle schools and high schools (for example, non-departmentalized continuation schools) require this credential. For further information on teaching credentials, see Education.

Grading Requirement:

The University requires a grade of at least C- in CMST 131, CMST 132, ENGL 130, ENGL 333, MATH 110, MATH 111, and PHIL 102 or approved equivalent for graduation.
