CHANTS/POETRY FRAMES

A Poetry Frame is a poem or song that lends itself to being adapted and expanded by students. The new content vocabulary is exchanged for the old, providing a low affective filter way to practice it. These poem/chants take advantage of patterning and negotiating for meaning.

The process should be modeled first by the teacher sharing a chant or poem s/he created on a different topic. Another way is to start the chant or poem and then have students help complete it. Students may be supported by using information previously gathered in a Process Grid or What I Learned from a KWL chart.

STEPS:

- 1. Know your key concepts and vocabulary
- 2. Pick a frame or song (e.g. a Cinquain poem example provided on webpage)
- 3. Count the syllables in each line
- 4. Replace the old words and insert the new vocabulary and concepts keeping the syllable count the same.
