Greetings from Camp Adventure!

Camp Adventure Child & Youth Services is now hiring skilled, enthusiastic students to be Camp Counselors, Child Development Interns or Aquatic Counselors (Lifeguards and Swim Instructors) for the summer of 2020!

Camp Adventure is a service-learning program for college credit, that provides early childhood, school-age and summer youth services to US Military installations all around the world. Participating students have traveled to over 150 program sites in 19 countries, including Germany, Italy, Belgium, Spain, Russia, Japan, South Korea, China, and the United States including Hawaii.

Camp Adventure Child and Youth Services provides airfare to and from your placement, housing, as well as a general living stipend of \$25 a day.

Requirements

- Strong previous work experience with children in a *professional group setting* (The ideal applicant will have 200 or more hours, though we encourage all to apply!)
- Minimum of a 2.5 GPA
- Completed 1 semester of college by your participation summer
- U.S Citizen

• Background check cleared by the military (done after the application process)

The application process:

Step 1: [Click HERE to fill out an interest card](#)

Step 2: Once your form is reviewed, you will receive an online application to be filled out. This email will come from our Camp Adventure Headquarters so please check your spam folder if you have not gotten one!

Step 3: Attend one of our Leadership Assessment Centers (Group Interview). You may choose any one of the following:

Sacramento State: November 16th

Chico State: December 7th

If you are accepted into the program following LAC, you will be expected to participate in Staff Development. This is when you will learn everything you need to know about our services, military life, and our summer camp programming. The tentative dates are:

Chico State: Feb 1 & 2, Feb 22 & 23, Mar 7 & 8, Apr 4 & 5, Apr 18th

Chico State students will register for Recreation 185, a for-credit, graded course that will act as your Staff Development. Traditionally, all students who meet the expectations of the Staff Development Program have received A's.

Program Information

Our typical programs are 10-12 weeks long during the summer. You would be leaving around the beginning of June, and returning around the middle/end of August.

We have a variety of different programs including CDC programs working with kids ages 0-5, Day Camp programs working with kids ages 6-11, middle school/teen programs working with kids 12-18, and aquatics programs working with kids at a variety of ages.

By participating in our program you get 12 credit hours for a reduced rate for your time during the summer. You also get airfare and housing paid for, as well as a living stipend of around \$25/day.

We have 12 training sites located throughout the US, so you would most likely be working with other college students from all over the country as well as other students from Iowa. At your site you will also be in contact with a military Point of Contact, who will help set up your camp for the summer.
