1. Announcements
 - a. Jeff Gold from the Chancellor's Office will be on campus March 28 for GI 2025 business.
 - b. This is the 6th annual STOP Human Trafficking Awareness Week. Events are scheduled throughout the week.
 - c. This summer Chris is participating in a CELT writing workshop, [Academy e-Learning 9.2: Best Practices for Working with Student Writing](#). Others are encouraged to sign up; compensation is \$750.
2. Approval of Minutes from 3/6/17
 - a. Approved
3. Veterans and GC
 - a. Kris Reddy, veteran's rep to Student Senate, asked CAB to consider awarding Global Cultures credit to veterans who have deployed to a foreign country. Currently, Charlene's office will occasionally receive petitions for students who completed course work while deployed and will potentially waive GC after reviewing.
 - b. Veterans currently receive Area E credit for Basic Training.
 - c. Would need to work out details of how to determine if student is eligible (not all veterans serve out of country) and best way to advertise/communicate policy to students.
 - d. Find out if other CSU's have a policy
4. 5-year review; results of planning committee discussion
 - a. The committee met last week to begin planning. Chris provided a summary of the meeting in a handout. Ideas for review include: student, faculty, and advisor surveys; aggregating assessment data; data collection from the Office of the Registrar; Pathway review; possibly course-level review. Using CAB members' knowledge and experience will be important.
 - b. Contact Chris with more ideas or questions
5. Applications for addition to the pathway program
 - a. Several applications have been received and more may be coming in.
 - b. CIVL 131 has applied for Area E in Sustainability but there is not an opening available. NFSC 100 is in both Food Studies and Sustainability so Chris will reach out to NFSC Chair to see if they are willing to give up their Sustainability spot. If not, CIVL 131 could be treated as an Experimental course.

- c. UNIV 101 applying as an Area E Experimental course (not affiliated with a Pathway).
 - d. FLNG 125 is a new course applying for A3 Foundation as well as two Pathways and GC. Chris will consult with Philosophy department for their input on FLNG 125 as an A3 Critical Thinking course.
 - e. Chris will disseminate applications soon and Pathway coordinators can create committees to review applications and bring a recommendation to CAB. Decisions should be made by the end of the semester.

 - a. Rachel is working with ten courses in the Sustainability Pathway on InTeGrate project (Interdisciplinary Teaching about Earth for a Sustainable Future).
 - b. Online curriculum modules have been created that can be used in classes to increase “Earth Literacy” of all students.
 - c. Modules consist of data-rich activities and address societal issues.
