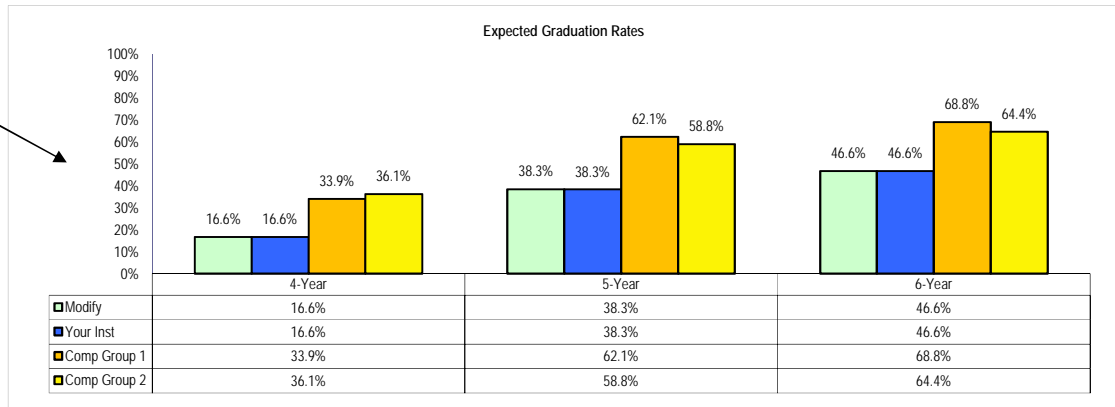
How to Use the Expected Graduation Rate Calculator

The Expected Graduation Rate Calculator has been pre-populated with results from your CIRP Freshman Survey administration. The darkest bar (in blue) represents the percentage of students expected to graduate in four, five or six years, based upon the entering characteristics of your students.

The calculator is generated based on first-time, full-time respondents to the CIRP Freshman Survey. Comparison group data are nationally-normed to reflect the American first-time full-time freshman population at baccalaureate institutions.

In the "modify" column, you can forecast changes to your degree completion rate by altering the characteristics of the incoming class.

Bar Graphs and Charts - Display your institution's and your comparison groups' expected graduation rates at four, five, and six years. In addition to your institution's rate, the "Modify" rate displays your institution's rate if you were to change the characteristics of the students your institution enrolls.

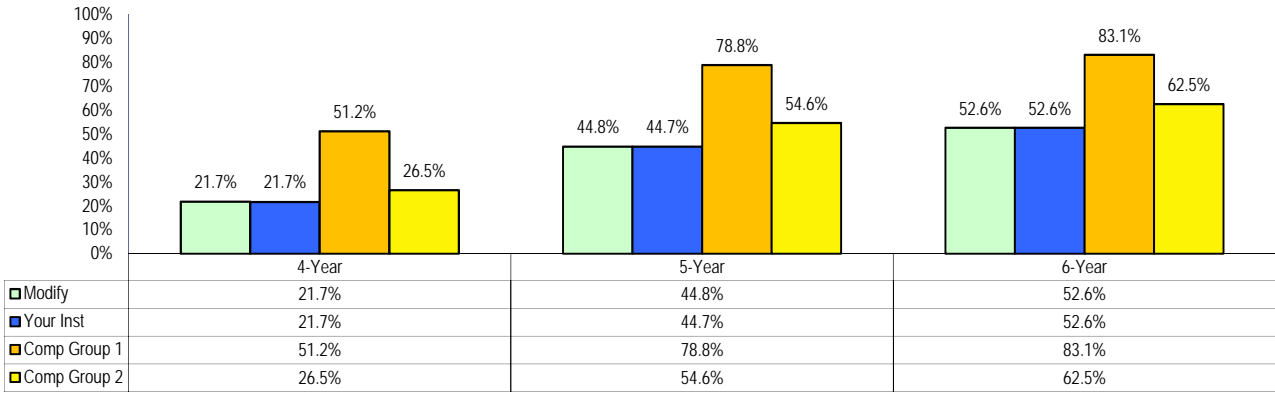
Response Columns - contain response percentages for your institution and your comparison groups for each of the survey items that were significant in predicting graduation rates at four, five, and six years.

** - Denotes a survey response option that is a reference group in the Expected Graduation Rate model. Modifications to these response options do not change the expected graduation rates.

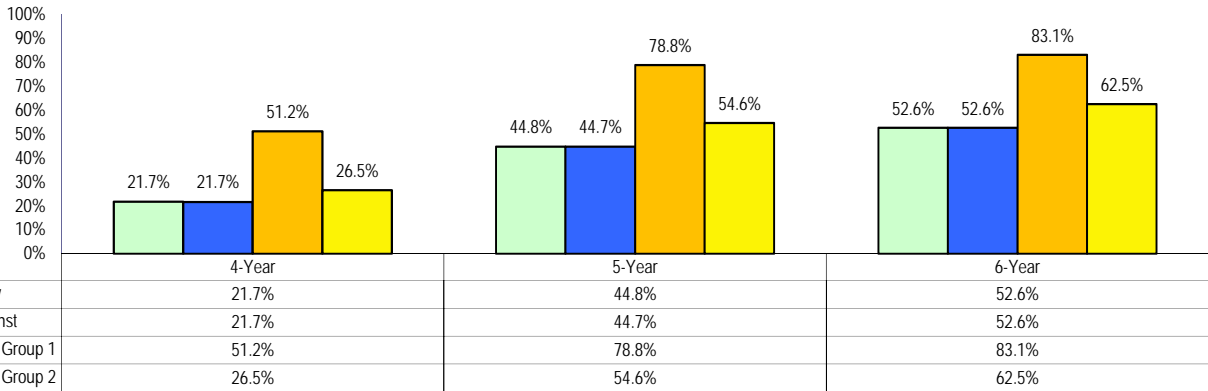

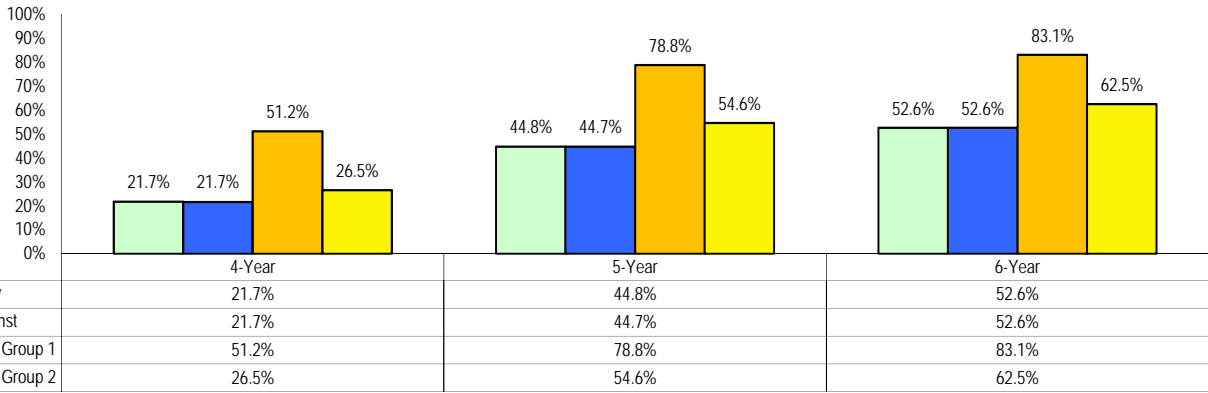

Expected Graduation Rates: 2015 Cohort



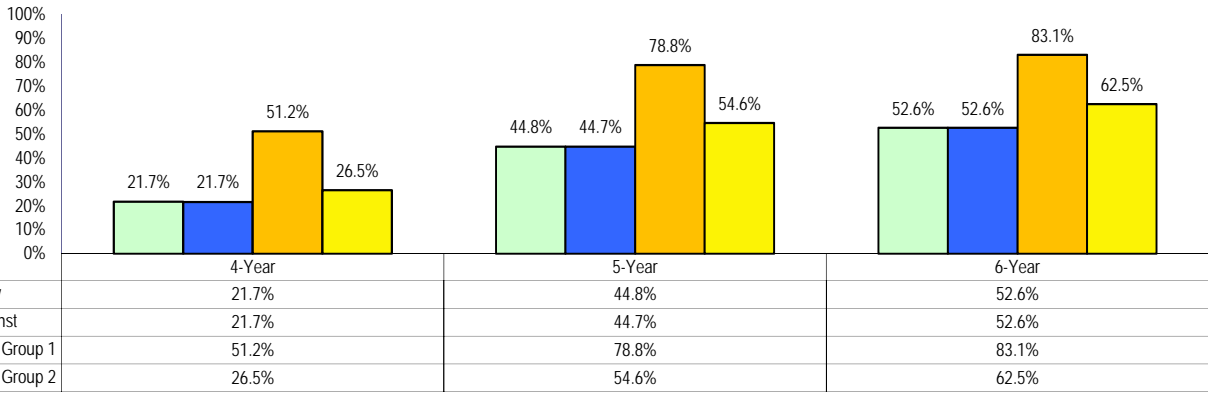

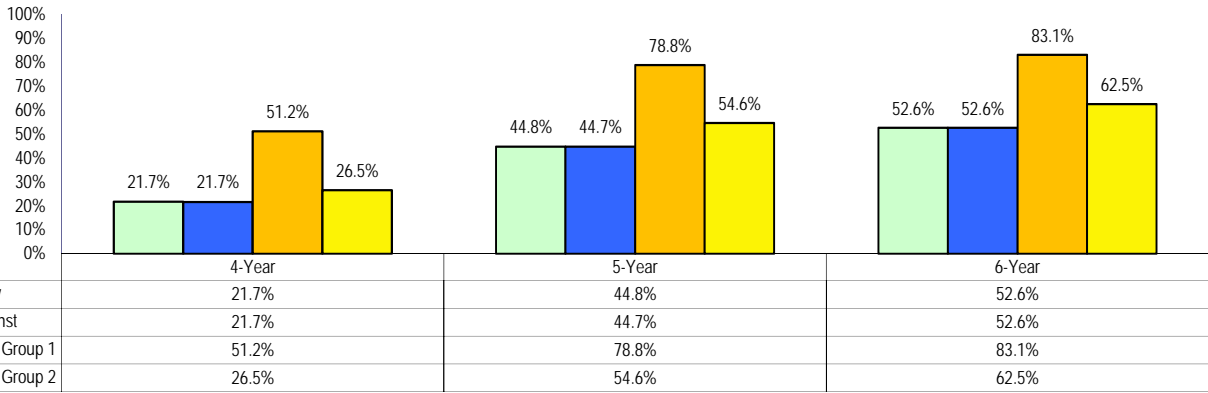

Expected Graduation Rates: 2015 Cohort



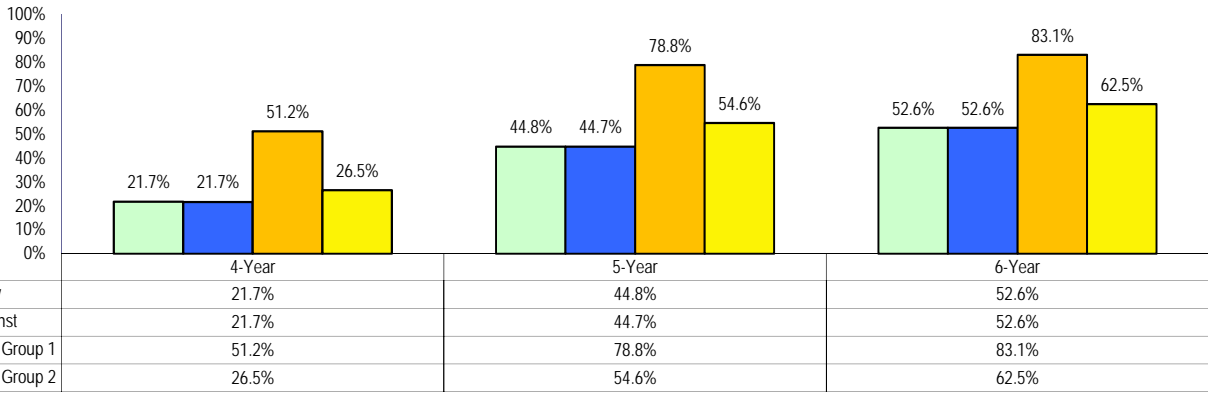

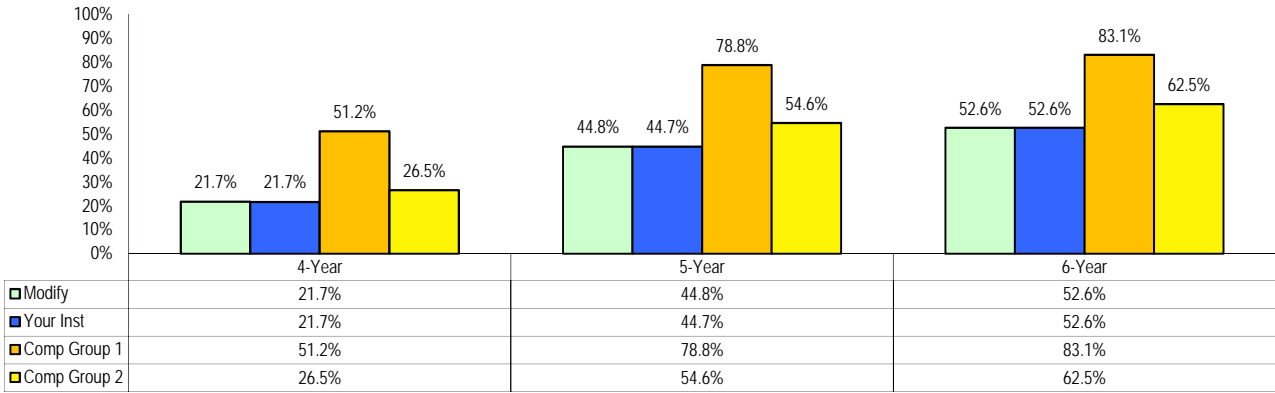

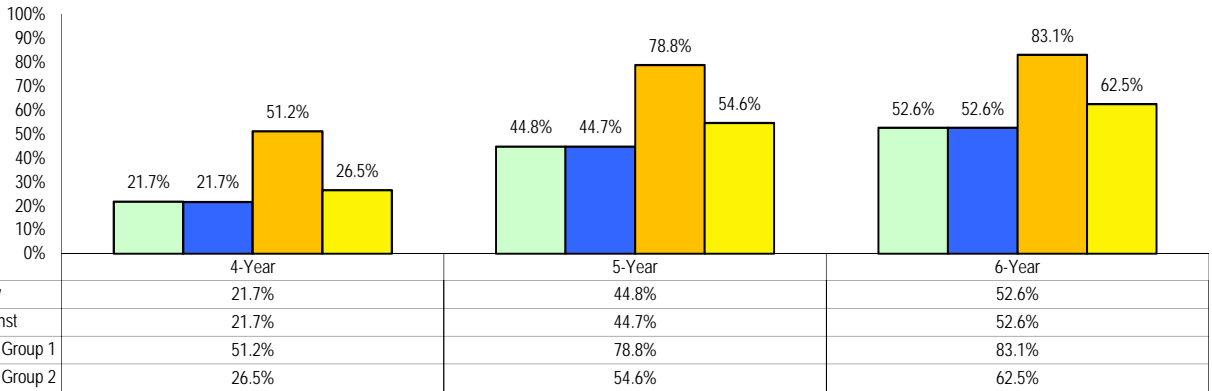

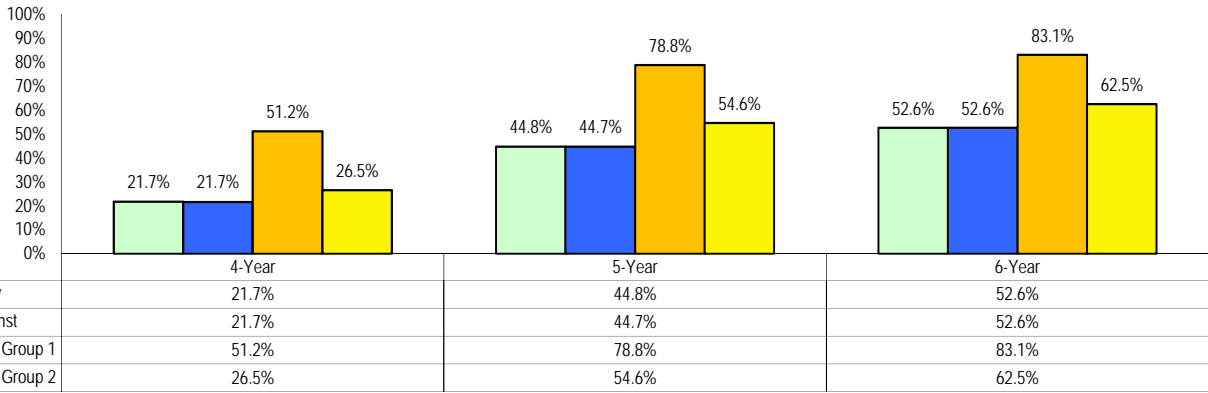

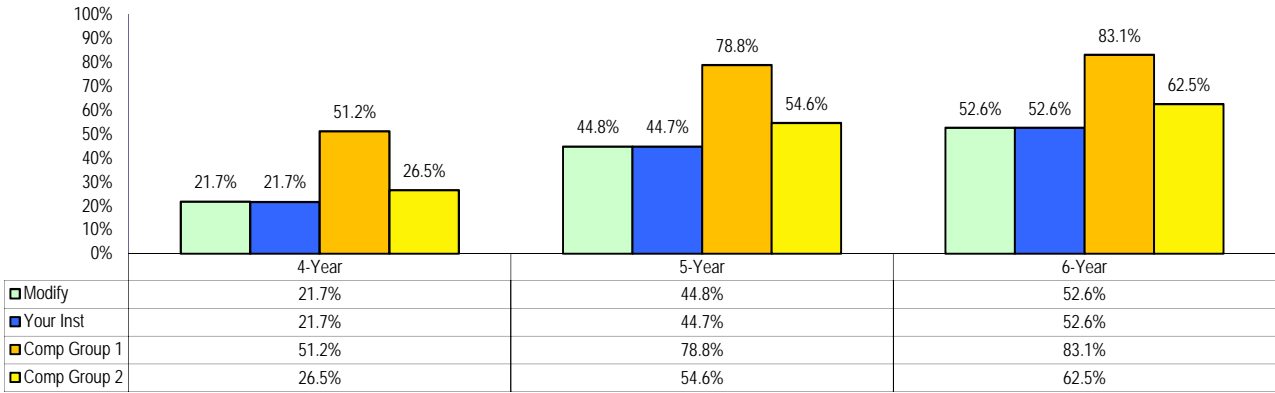
