6. What process does your college/unit use to determine baseline budget allocations each year?

BSS uses the baseline amount that IRA has determined as the BSS IRA program baselines; we have not made any adjustments thus far to their baselines. However, all three of our IRA funded programs regularly go beyond their IRA baseline allocations, funded by our IRA carryforward. Before COVID, we anticipated that carryforward will be all but depleted in the coming AY if their respective baselines are not increased, limiting the potential that each IRA program has demonstrated can be accomplished. My process in providing carryover funding for each of the programs is straightforward. I send each IRA program coordinator an email that if they wish additional IRA funding to meet with me so that we can talk about how much they hope to get and how that money will facilitate student learning and success. For the Museum of Anthropology, that might translate in buying material needed to put on an exhibit that they otherwise could not do; for Model UN that means more students able to participate in regional and national competitions; for Butte Creek Outdoor classroom that means being able to hire more students to help coordinate outdoor fieldtrips for CSU and K-12 students, and purchase supporting equipment. I already know the BSS IRA programs provide ‘high impact’ opportunities for students: more funding means scaling up what they do to serve more students.

7. How are each of the activities/programs in your college/unit evaluated each year?

I evaluate each according to the degree to which funding forwarded their respective goals, keeping in mind the importance of number of students served and the degree to which the programs provide student high impact experiences. If a program does not expend their baseline funding (a rare event before COVID, but it has happened), I meet with the program coordinator to find out what is going on and

determine whether the issue is short-term or indicative of a bigger systemic problem. In general, I keep up with what the programs are doing.
