#### **Winter Session**

The winter session starts January 2<sup>nd</sup> through January 19<sup>th</sup>. This will be your final Upper Division GE course: QTST 310 LGBTQ Issues & Identities in Winter Session. ## **Clinical Introduction Meeting**

To ensure your successful clinical onboarding, we will be hosting two informational meetings on January 30, 2024, 9-10am, and February 5th, 3-4pm, on Zoom. Attendance at one of these meetings is mandatory. The purpose of this meeting is to review the clinical clearance process and address any questions you may have as you prepare for and look forward to your clinical experience. The clinical clearance process is detailed and lengthy, and you will have several steps to complete throughout the spring semester leading up to the start of your clinical in the summer session 2. We will be discussing immunizations, health documentation, background, drug screening, HIPAA modules and other required training, clinical badges, and more. Please save the date for this important meeting. Please note, you need to attend only one of the meeting dates listed above.

## **Apply for Graduation**

Applying for graduation prompts Graduating Advising to complete an official degree audit that will clear you for graduation and allow your degree to be issued upon completion of all remaining requirements. During this process, you will be alerted of any missing requirements.

By now, you should have already applied for Graduation. August 15, 2023, was the on-time deadline to apply for summer 2023 graduation. To avoid the late fee, students must apply and pay fees due one year in advance, and by the on-time deadline. The graduation application fee is \$68. The late fee is \$10. To change your graduation date, the re-file fee is \$8.

Go to the <u>Graduation Application website</u>. Scroll down and click the red button "Apply for Your Bachelor's Degree" and follow the prompts.

## **Register for Commencement Ceremony**

RN-BSN students who will be graduating in summer 2024 are invited and encouraged to participate in the spring 2024 commencement ceremony! This is great opportunity for you to celebrate your accomplishments amongst other nursing students and invite your friends and family! All majors within the College Natural Sciences, including Nursing, will walk at the Sunday, May 19, 2024, ceremony starting at 9am at the University Stadium.
