Check your Wildcat e-mail for updated communications on all your classes. Faculty will also use *Blackboard Learn* to communicate with students regarding nursing classes. If you need to take other elective classes, Thursday evenings would work the best with your School of Nursing (SON) schedule for third semester.

Clinical Requirements – This is extremely important. Updates of all clinical requirements are due to SentryMD by Monday, August 2, 2021 (subject to change...check School of Nursing website). These requirements include updating proof of health and auto insurances (make sure your name appears on the submitted policy), as well as any expiring immunizations (i.e., PPD tests, flu vaccine) or CPR certifications. If your CPR expires soon, schedule renewal now and make sure you take the correct course. The CPR card needs to read, "Healthcare Professional or Healthcare Provider" and is good for two years. **Please note:** If clinical requirements are not updated by August 2, students may be unenrolled from clinical courses, which could affect financial aid eligibility. You will also lose professional points in your courses if this is not completed on time.

*****Please plan on being in class every day for the first week of the semester for orientation and skills labs.***

N343 Medical-Surgical Nursing II Wednesdays 0800-1100. This course is a continuation of N303. Format of the course TBA. You will use the same textbooks for N343 that were used in N304.

N344: Medical- Surgical Nursing II Practicum

This is a 90 hour clinical practicum course that will meet on Mondays. You will have 2 simulation days and one skills lab day, and all will be scheduled on Mondays. Skills lab for all sections is planned to take place on Monday August 23, 2021. Faculty will provide you with exact times for your section prior to the start of the semester. Enloe students must complete Oak modules and attend hospital orientation on Tuesday, August 24, 2021. Please see N314 Enloe schedule for details. If you will be at Enloe for N344 and N314, please note you only need to attend Enloe orientation for one of your classes.

Section 1 - Enloe Medical Center-5th Floor 8 hours on Mondays for a total of 90 hours. Faculty will provide students with exact dates of attendance.

Section 2 - Enloe Medical Center-3rd Floor 8 hours on Mondays for a total of 90 hours. Faculty will provide students with exact dates of attendance.

N313 –Maternal/Child Lecture

N313 is the maternal/child lecture course which is taught in two separate 2-hour lectures on Wednesday afternoons for the entire semester.

N314 –Maternal/Child Practicum

N314 is the 135-hour clinical component which is taught either at Mercy Medical Center in Redding or Enloe Medical Center in Chico. All sections rotate through acute (hospital) OB and Pediatrics and have **many additional components, which include skills labs, assignments, and simulation training.** *****In addition to your regularly scheduled clinical day (Tu or F/S), there will be three Thursdays required for Simulation (Dates TBA).*****

ATI RN Dosage Calculation 3.0 Assessments- All third semester students will be required to take the proctored ATI Pediatric and Maternal Newborn Dosage Calculation Assessments the first week of the semester. **By 5:00 pm on Sunday 8/22/21, you must have completed the two tutorial practice tests within ATI RN Dosage Calculation 3.0 within the previous 60 days with a score of 90% or higher; Dosage Calculation RN Maternal/Newborn and Dosage Calculation RN Nursing Care of Children.** There is no need to print proof of completion as your clinical instructor will check online. **You will not be allowed entrance to take the proctored exams without completion of the tutorials, and if not completed by the deadline, there will be a loss of points. Proctored ATI Maternal/Newborn and Pediatric dosage exams will take place Friday 8/27/2021.** To access the tutorials, please log into www.atitesting.com and go to the Products section and then the Tutorial tab. You may not pass meds in the hospital clinical rotations until both the Pediatric and Maternal Newborn Dosage Calculation Assessments are passed with a

score of 90%. You will also take the ATI proctored content assessments for Maternal/Newborn and Pediatric later in the semester.

N314-FIRST WEEK OF THE SEMESTER-

N314 Orientation- We will be holding **OB/Peds Orientation** on Tuesday 8/24, 1:00-5:00 pm, and Thursday, 8/26 and Fri 8/27 from 9:00am-5:00pm. Please keep these dates open as there is much to cover before starting in hospital clinicals. These are **mandatory orientations and there is no make-up available**. A few days prior to the beginning of school, your N314 Blackboard course will be available that contains your syllabus and course supplement. Entrance to orientation requires an uploaded copy of the **ATI CERTIFICATE showing** completion of the HIPAA module in Blackboard for N313 (you complete these three times during the nursing program).

Tuesday, August 24, Enloe On-Site Skills Lab/Computer Charting Training - 7:50am-12:00pm Meet at the Enloe Conference Center at 7:50am. This is for ALL Semester 3 students that have ANY clinical rotations at Enloe Medical Center (Med/Surg or OB/Peds).
