Rational for change:

*disciplinary convention, recruitment, and employment issues

No new courses are being added for the minor, but reflect courses added or adapted previously including Social Media Photography and Social Media Storytelling; adapted content within courses including Technology and Communication, which now includes social media theory and analytics; existing courses including Social Media Technology; or current revision such as Programming and Audience Analysis, soon to be Media Analytics. Where appropriate, collaboration with other departments, including CAGD and JOUR, is ongoing. The minor has both student and department support as reflected in the student requests for a minor, contributed courses from CAGD and JOUR (email documentation available upon request from CAGD and JOUR) and MADT Department vote (confirmation available from MADT chair.)

Students in the Social Media Production and Analysis minor learn how to supplement, support and enhance their academic disciplines and professional interests with social media production and analysis. The social media minor supports a variety of disciplines, including, but not limited to, communication and education (media creation for online and hybrid eLearning environments); entrepreneurship and business (media creation for eCommerce and training); the humanities such as fine, recording and performance arts (transmedia applications supporting a variety of showcase, presentation and deliverables); and behavioral and social sciences (vlogging, audio podcasting, web design, internet of things and various forms of web media for social engagement and activism.)

Hi Tom,

Looks like a great program! Once it's in place, I'll be recommending it to our students.

I polled the Composition/Rhetoric faculty, and they do use social media posts regularly as elements for rhetorical analysis, so they felt that the course would fit well within your program. They also wondered whether ENGL 330W, Intro to Technical Writing, might work as well — while not focused on social media, that course does focus very closely on figuring out how to match writing tasks with the constraints of specific audiences and purposes, so there could potentially be some positive transfer. ENGL 335W is a course within our major's core requirements, so it's offered every semester, and ENGL 330W is UD GE, so also offered each semester (if those matter). We would be happy to welcome your students to either class.

The Social Media Production and Analysis minor is intended to expand and support diverse student population's success through craft based skills (production) and literacy (analysis) in social media technology (production) and platforms (analysis). For many years, the Media Arts Design and Technology department has prepared students in our majors for professional careers in the media industry. Within the major we have expanded our curriculum to reflect changes in the industry, notably the explosion of social media (we are also offering Social media GE courses). We recognize that today social media content and platforms are leveraged by both media professionals and non-media professionals alike to support a variety social, political and professional goals. This Minor reflects The College of Communication and Educations guiding commitment to "enable access and equity" for all students across a variety of disciplines by helping them to "craft meaningful, responsible & responsive narratives" as pertains to their goals, as part of our vision to "Educate the whole person."

No new courses are being added for the minor, but reflect courses added or adapted previously including Social Media Photography and Social Media Storytelling; adapted content within courses

including Technology and Communication, which now includes social media theory and analytics; existing courses including Social Media Technology; and current revisions such as Programming and Audience Analysis, soon to be Media Analytics. As a zero cost minor, The Social Media Production and Analysis minor supports the University strategic priority to create <u>"resilient & sustainable systems."</u> In part, we are able to offer the Social Media Production and Analysis Minor "zero cost" through collaboration with other departments, including CAGD and JOUR, <u>"emphasizing University-community partnerships that are collaborative, participatory, empowering, systematic and transformative" (University Strategic Plan Priority.)</u> The minor has student, department and college support.

Students in the Social Media Production and Analysis minor learn how to supplement, support and enhance their academic disciplines and professional interests with social media production and analysis. The social media minor supports a variety of disciplines, including, but not limited to, communication and education (media creation for online and hybrid eLearning environments — Academic Plan Theme 2: Cultivating a Culture of Excellence in Teaching and Learning through appropriate technologies and training in their use); entrepreneurship and business (media creation for eCommerce and training; Academic Plan Theme 1: Prepare Students for Lifelong success); the humanities such as fine, recording and performance arts (transmedia applications supporting a variety of showcase, presentation and deliverables; Academic Plan Theme 1: Prepare Students for Lifelong success); and behavioral and social sciences (vlogging, audio podcasting, web design, internet of things and various forms of web media for social engagement and activism; Diversity Action Plan priority 3: as co-curricular program fostering diversity competencies and engagement.)





Within the assigned call number ranges for this discipline, the number of titles which fall into these areas are not expansive. There are 545 print titles and 313 in the assigned call numbers of the Media Arts, Design, & Technology. Since this discipline is interdisciplinary, there are many more titles outside the assigned call number range which could be utilized by faculty and students. It is recommended that instructional faculty work with their librarian to acquire additional texts as needed to enhance our holdings for the discipline.

The databases which students in this major would utilize could include:

- Art Source
- Ebsco
- Sage
- Proquest
- Wiley

As this minor utilizes existing courses, the library is able to support the minor.

Looks like a great program! Once it's in place, I'll be recommending it to our students.

I polled the Composition/Rhetoric faculty, and they do use social media posts regularly as elements for rhetorical analysis, so they felt that the course would fit well within your program. They also wondered whether ENGL 330W, Intro to Technical Writing, might work as well — while not focused on social media, that course does focus very closely on figuring out how to match writing tasks with the constraints of specific audiences and purposes, so there could potentially be some positive transfer. ENGL 335W is a course within our major's core requirements, so it's offered every semester, and ENGL 330W is UD GE, so also offered each semester (if those matter). We would be happy to welcome your students to either class.
