Deborah Summers, Director of the School of Education, will provide an overview of AURTEC (All University Responsibility for Teacher Education Committee). AURTEC provides program and policy oversight of the teacher education programs. The committee is guided by EM 07-012 (attached).

5. Discussion item: AlcoholEdu.

Trisha Seastrom, Program Manager for CADEC (Campus Alcohol and Drug Education Center), will provide an overview of AlcoholEdu. AlcoholEdu is a web-based alcohol education program required for all **incoming freshman**. Beginning in 2010, the university has been administering "AlcoholEdu for College" to our entire first-year student population, with the goal of not only changing individual students' knowledge and behaviors, but changing the drinking culture on campus as a whole. In accomplishing this, the desired result is that this will create a community with a common educational experience that will foster the development of a campus culture that supports healthy decision-making and increases the students' ability to take care of each other in risky social settings.

Students must complete the AlcoholEdu "test" with a minimum grade of 70%.

Students not achieving a score of 70% or higher must retake the test and score at least 70% in order to enroll for spring semester.

CADEC is proposing changes to the program.

- 1) requiring new transfer students to complete the program in addition to incoming freshmen
- 2) raising the required passing score from 70% to 80%
