



## SUMMER BRIDGE COURSE & CONCENTRATION COURSES

In addition to the summer Concentration Courses, MSW One-Year DL Program students (those with a BSW degree) must also enroll in, and successfully complete, the summer bridge course prior to progressing into the fall Concentration Courses.

*\*No electives are required with a Master's Project or a Master's Thesis.*

MSW students can complete no more than 2 units of Master's Study (699T/699P) per semester in the Concentration year with a maximum of 4 units total, and no more than 3 units of Independent Study (697) per semester with a total of 6 units for the year. Both 699T/699P and 697 courses require MSW Director and faculty support.

### Course Format Key:

(O) = Fully online, asynchronous course

(H) = Hybrid, with a combination of asynchronous and synchronous course time. Hybrid courses require attendance to scheduled class time via Zoom and class attendance during two weekends on-campus, face-to-face, each semester.
