

Supplemental Criteria for Admission to the CSUC BSW Professional Sequence

TRADITIONAL	DISTRIBUTED LEARNING (DL)
<p>For students who are already attending or planning to transfer to CSU Chico, completion of a minimum of 60 transferable semester units (90 quarter units) by Summer preceding applicant's Junior year. The 60 units must include all five of the General Education (GE) requirements including the 'Golden Four' (A1-A4):</p> <p>A1 Oral Communication, A2 Written Communication, A3 Critical Thinking A4 Quantitative Reasoning - Statistics with a minimum of a C; B2 Life Science: (Human Anatomy, Human Biology or Human Physiology) with a minimum of a C; D1 Individual & Society – Introduction to Sociology SOCI 100 or Principles of Micro Analysis ECON 103 with a minimum of a C; D2 Political & Economic Institutions – Introduction to Economics ECON 101 or Principles of Macro Analysis ECON 102 with a minimum of a C. And Principles of Psychology PSY 101 with a minimum of a C.</p>	<p>Same criteria as the traditional BSW option unless otherwise noted.</p>
<p>Completion of all eight Social Work Core Courses with a minimum of a 'C' grade by the conclusion of the Fall semester of the applicant's junior year. CSU Chico continuing students and new transfer students have equal consideration in terms of admission to the BSW Professional Sequence. California non-residents Professional Sequence applications are considered only when program spaces are not filled by California residents within the 18-county area.</p>	
<p>For students who are already attending or planning to transfer to CSU Chico, completion of a minimum of 60 transferable semester units (90 quarter units) by Summer preceding applicant's Junior year there are 20 points cumulative possible based on grades in each one of the five courses: Statistics, Human Anatomy/Biology/Physiology, Psychology, Sociology and Economics.</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;"> A = 4.0 A- = 3.7 B+ = 3.3 B = 3.0 B- = 2.7 C+ = 2.3 C = 2.0 </p>	
<p>Be in good academic standing at the last institution attended with a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA with 6 points possible:</p> <p>2.5 = 1 point 2.6 - 2.8 = 2 points 2.9 – 3.1 = 3 points 3.2 – 3.4 = 4 points 3.5 – 3.7 = 5 points 3.8 – 4.0 = 6 points</p>	<p>Be in good academic standing at the last institution attended with a minimum cumulative 2.1 GPA with 6 points possible:</p> <p>2.1 - 2.4 = 1 point 2.5 - 2.7 = 2 points 2.8 – 3.0 = 3 points 3.1 – 3.3 = 4 points 3.4 – 3.6 = 5 points 3.7 – 4.0 = 6 points</p>
<p>Residence or transfer from one of the community colleges located in the 18 Northern California counties included in the CSUC catchment area and/or served by the Superior Region WET Regional Partnership: Butte, Colusa, Del Norte, Glenn, Humboldt, Lake, Lassen, Mendocino, Modoc, Nevada, Plumas, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Sutter, Tehama, Trinity or Yuba</p>	
<p>Priority is given to veterans. = 4 points</p>	
<p>Not applicable</p>	<p>Priority is given to persons with disabilities. = 4 points</p>
<p>Fluency in priority languages will be highly considered: Spanish, Southeast Asian languages, California Indian languages, and American Sign Language. Native speakers or the ability to</p>	

converse with native speakers at a typical conversational level. = 4 points	
Paid experience in social and/or tribal services will be considered. = 6 points Volunteer experience as caregiver to other persons. = 3 points	
Volunteer experience in social services will be considered. Volunteer experience (minimum 60 hours). = 1 point
